2019 in Review

As we close out our 2019 season, we are so grateful for the giving we have received from clothes for our men to household supplies, from volunteer hours to financial partnerships and always we covet the prayers with which you have covered us and the work we are doing.

We talk about changing the family tree. As I review our last 15 graduates we see glimpses of that goal occurring. These men, who together served over 110 years in prison, are now embracing their role of fathers to over 40 children, breaking the fatherlessness they themselves experienced. Yes these men are in a better place due to having jobs and being able to provide, but we want so much more for our guys than just greater financial stability, we want to see the family tree changed emotionally, spiritually, mentally, and relationally.

To that end, in 2020, we plan to steward your financial partnership by hiring a full-time Case Manager, being intentional in our job preparedness process, and maintaining our counseling partnership. The Case Manager will walk with the guys through their time in the program and after to help them identify life goals, set effective plans to reach those goals and be their cheerleader throughout. The Case Manager will also work with the employers to help them navigate the waters of employing our men, as well as continuing to build the relationships with counseling services that have already started

There is so much I can talk about. Jobs of Hope is unique because we work with incarcerated, gang, and marginalized men who are searching for a way out of generational darkness. Through God's Grace, and your partnership we will provide the light. During this holiday season I ask that you would prayerfully consider what your partnership with us will look like for 2010 and going forward.

PRAYERFULLY CONSIDER HELPING


