Like most of our guys, Billy understands the battle with addiction, in his case it was alcohol, and the power of Christ to bring freedom. Through people, who acted as God's hands and feet, Billy is now five year sober and free from incarceration. He wants to pass along the hard-won lessons he has learned and bring love and hope into our guys' lives.

He does this practically by driving men to work at 5am since they do not have transportation right now. Billy will tell you that he has been through pure misery since childhood looking for the love he never had, today by the "Grace of God I am thankful to be alive and able to help the next person who was in my shoes".

Billy was also instrumental in getting our office straightened up a bit. We had this large desk that was taking up more space than we could afford, and it was attacking Jazz at times (the keyboard sliding "drawer-thing" fell on her) so we decided to remove it. A couple of guys were the muscle and Billy (in the hat) was the transportation. His grin in the picture is true to life and brings such joy to all who see it! We and the guys are so blessed to have Billy around.
