Mark worked here in Greeley and eventually fell into the world of drugs. He also had a child who is now 14 years old being raised by the mother's relatives as she is still a drug addict. Mark's lifestyle landed him in the Colorado Prison System and many days in the Weld County Jail.



Mark has been out of prison for many years now, however, his drug addiction has kept him from keeping long term employment. He is now married with a newborn and working hard in the program. He acknowledges that Jobs of Hope gave him the skills to persevere, which was a barrier for him throughout his years prior. He will be employed within the next week and looking for Christ to give him the strength to endure.
